

## The Message of Evangelism

1. The message of the C\_\_\_\_\_ G\_\_\_\_\_ to whom we must all give an a\_\_\_\_\_ (Psalm 33:6-17, Acts 13:13-46, 14:8-18, 17:22-31; Hebrews 4:31).

“The gospel starts by teaching us that we, as creatures, are absolutely dependent on God, and that He, as Creator, has an absolute claim on us. Only when we have learned this can we see what sin is, and only when we see what sin is can we understand the good news of salvation from sin.”

2. The message of s\_\_\_\_\_ as r\_\_\_\_\_ against God, not just as b\_\_\_\_\_ f\_\_\_\_\_ or a g\_\_\_\_\_ c\_\_\_\_\_ (Romans 3:10-20). This calls for a c\_\_\_\_\_ of s\_\_\_\_\_ and s\_\_\_\_\_ on the part of the sinner (Luke 19:8, Psalm 51:1-10).
3. The message of J\_\_\_\_\_. We must present both the P\_\_\_\_\_ of C\_\_\_\_\_ and the w\_\_\_\_\_ of C\_\_\_\_\_ (I Corinthians 15:1-4, I Timothy 1:15, Acts 17:31). The Apostles’ Creed is a great summary of the p\_\_\_\_\_ and w\_\_\_\_\_ of Christ.
4. The message of r\_\_\_\_\_ and f\_\_\_\_\_. These are both acts of the w\_\_\_\_\_ m\_\_\_\_\_ throughout his w\_\_\_\_\_ l\_\_\_\_\_ (Acts 20:21, Luke 9:23-26, Matthew 28:20).
