

## Lessons from Acts 11:1-18

- **Interpreting Repeat Narratives**

1. Consider Different Perspectives - L\_\_\_\_\_ gives a t\_\_\_\_\_ p\_\_\_\_\_ account in chapter ten, and P\_\_\_\_\_ gives a f\_\_\_\_\_ p\_\_\_\_\_ account in chapter eleven.
2. Consider Different Purposes - The narrative in chapter ten emphasizes that it is the s\_\_\_\_\_ g\_\_\_\_\_ of Jesus that saves both J\_\_\_\_\_ and G\_\_\_\_\_. The narrative in chapter eleven emphasizes that the c\_\_\_\_\_ in J\_\_\_\_\_, like P\_\_\_\_\_, embraced this truth.
3. Consider Different Details - In Acts 11:12, we learn that Peter brought s\_\_\_\_\_ b\_\_\_\_\_ with him to visit C\_\_\_\_\_. In Acts 11:16, we learn that Peter r\_\_\_\_\_ our Savior's t\_\_\_\_\_ about the b\_\_\_\_\_ of the Holy Spirit (Acts 1:4-5).

- **Four Works of the Holy Spirit**

1. The Holy Spirit told P\_\_\_\_\_ to v\_\_\_\_\_ C\_\_\_\_\_ (Acts 11:12, Acts 10:19-20, John 15:26-27, Acts 1:8).
2. The Holy Spirit f\_\_\_\_\_ upon the G\_\_\_\_\_ just as He did upon the J\_\_\_\_\_ (Acts 11:15-16).
3. The Holy Spirit c\_\_\_\_\_ Peter to r\_\_\_\_\_ Christ's words about water and Holy Spirit b\_\_\_\_\_ (Acts 11:16, Acts 1:4-5, John 14:25-26).
4. The Holy Spirit granted r\_\_\_\_\_ to the G\_\_\_\_\_ (Acts 11:18, Titus 3:4-7).

- **An Emphasis on Repentance**

1. A central theme of g\_\_\_\_\_ p\_\_\_\_\_ in Acts is that r\_\_\_\_\_ must accompany f\_\_\_\_\_ for Jews and Gentiles alike (Acts 2:38, 3:19-21, 5:31-32, 20:20-21).
2. Repentance, like faith, is a s\_\_\_\_\_ g\_\_\_\_\_ that the Holy Spirit must grant to s\_\_\_\_\_ (Ephesians 2:8-9, II Timothy 2:24-25).
3. Repentance comes to all who r\_\_\_\_\_ the w\_\_\_\_\_ of the gospel (Acts 2:41, 8:14, and 11:1).
